

At the 14the meeting of this Subcommittee between Montenegro and the European Union, which covered chapters 1 – Free movement of goods, 16 – Taxation, 20 – Enterprise and industrial policy, 29 – Customs union and 30 - External relations, representatives of the relevant Montenegrin institutions informed the EC representatives about the activities carried out in the previous period in these areas. 
