INTRODUCTION

The semi-annual report on the implementation of the Action Plan for Chapter 23 for the period July-December 2018 is the eighth one since the adaptation of the Action Plan of 19 February 2015. In the reporting period, a total of 200 measures from the Action Plan became due for implementation, out of which 13 measures (7%) were implemented, 158 measures (79%) are continuously implemented, 16 measures (8%) were partially implemented and a total of 13 measures (6%) were not implemented. A tabular and graphical representation of the implementation of measures are included hereinafter.

A semi-annual report on the implementation of the Operational Document for Corruption Prevention in Special Risk Areas, annex to the Action Plan, for the period July-December 2018 is the fifth report. In the reporting period, a total of 54 measures became due for implementation, out of which 10 (19%) were implemented, 33 (61%) were continuously implemented, 3 (5%) were partially implemented and 8 measures (15%) were not implemented.

1 JUDICIARY

1.1 INDEPENDENCE OF JUDICIARY

1.1.1 Recommendation: Montenegro needs to amend its Constitution in line with the recommendations of the Venice Commission and the European standards, in order to ensure the independence and accountability of the judiciary. The amendments, inter alia, should include the following issues: - At least 50% of the Judicial Council and the Prosecutorial Council members should come from the judiciary. These members should be elected by their peers who represent different levels of the judiciary, without any interference by the Parliament (other than purely declarative). - Prosecutors should not be elected by the Parliament. - The reasons for the dismissal of judges and prosecutors should be incorporated into the Constitution.

Administration of administrative procedures related to prevention of conflicts of interest and limitations in the performance of public functions - From 01 January to 30 June 2018, the Agency received 26 reportings and acted ex officio in 7 cases. 22 requests for initiation of administrative proceedings before the Agency were sent because of: conflict of interest-procedures and for the performance of incompatible functions, non-transfer of management rights (22 upon registration of another natural or legal person and 7 on the basis of their own request). After the completed administrative procedures, 22 Decisions were made. Also, the Agency completed 11 cases in the previous procedure after the registration of the unidentified person and other natural persons, as there were no

elements for initiating proceedings before the Agency.

The violation was found for 17 public officials (7 for conflict of interest and 10 for restrictions) In the period from January to June 2018, the Agency conducted 12 proceedings in connection with conflict of interest and issued 12 decisions, of which 7 cases found that public officials were in conflict of interest, after the decision was made by the Agency to one public official, resigned from the public office, one disciplinary measure of warning in the form of a conclusion was pronounced and two information from the authorities that the procedure for pronouncing a disciplinary measure is in progress. On the basis of the conducted procedures in the reporting period regarding the restrictions in the exercise of public functions, the Agency issued 10 Decisions, which found violations for all 10 public officials. After the decisions of the Agency and the given Opinions were adopted, 23 resignations of public officials with public office were submitted, while in the reporting period after the initiation of the procedure before the Agency, the service contract between the public official and authorities was terminated, the Agency concluded that it is contrary to the law.

The number of public officials and submitted declarations on 20 December

2018. A total of 4,428 public officials were registered in the electronic database of the Agency. Additionally, 1,341 civil servants obliged to submit an income and asset declaration prescribed in accordance with separate laws are registered. A regular annual income and asset declaration for 2017, which is submitted by 31 March of the current year for the previous year, was submitted by 4,200 or 95% of the total number of public officials, while 228 public officials (178 at the local level and 50 public officials at the state level) or 5% did not submit a regular annual income and asset declaration. -The income and asset declaration for 2017 was not submitted by 89 civil servants or 7% of the total number. As at 20 December 2018, 7,941 declarations of public officials and civil servants were submitted; they underwent the process of software and administrative checks (they were processed and validated). The following have been published on the Agency's website: - 5,275 regular annual declarations - 30 days from the date of taking office – 1,039; - at the request of the Agency - 68; - change above €5,000 - 396 public officials. Declarations of 1,157 public officials who have ceased to hold public office have been processed and are available on the Agency's website. These declarations have to be submitted after termination of public office: -30 days from termination of public office - 558; - Annual and biannual termination of public office -

599 public officials. Approval to access bank accounts was signed in 4,765 declarations of public officials and civil servants. A total of 228 procedures were initiated concerning public officials who did not submit a regular annual declaration (178 local and 50 state ones). In addition to public officials, 1,341 civil servants were registered as at 20 December 2018. A total of 89 procedures were initiated regarding civil servants who did not submit a regular annual declaration. Information on approvals to access bank accounts are available on the Agency's website. As regards conflict of interest prevention, from 1 January to 20 December 2018, aiming to act preventively, the Agency acted upon the requests of public officials and authorities and issued 185 opinions binding on public officials, which concerned: conflict of interest and disqualification from discussion and decision-making, restrictions when performing offices, incompatibility of office, membership in management bodies, membership in working bodies, receipt of remuneration, as well as restrictions upon termination of office, conclusion of the contract, receipt of donations, status of public officials. Conduct of administrative procedures regarding restrictions in the exercise of public office - From 1 January to 20 December 2018, the Agency initiated and completed a total of 71 procedures for: conflict of interest - procedures and violation of restrictions: performing incompatible offices, non-transferring of

managerial rights (43 upon a report of another natural or legal person and 28 on the basis of own request). Out of 71 completed administrative procedures, violations were found concerning 41 public officials or in 58% cases. In the period January-December 2018: - The Agency conducted 18 procedures related to conflict of interest and issued 18 decisions, of which it found in 11 cases or 61% that public officials were in a conflict of interest. After a decision was issued by the Agency, 1 public official resigned from public office, after which he was dismissed from public office, one disciplinary measure of admonition in the form of a conclusion was imposed, and two public officials were dismissed from public office, after a decision was issued, property gain in the amount of €10,815.15 was confiscated from one public official under a court decision, while in two cases the government authority informed the Agency that the procedure had not yet been completed. - Regarding the breach of provisions of the Law which relate to restrictions in the exercise of public office, the Agency issued 42 decisions, which found violations by 30 public officials or 71% of public officials against whom proceedings were conducted, while 12 officials did not violate the provisions of the law. - The Agency issued 11 acts terminating the procedure in administrative matters on the requests of other persons (unidentified persons included) in which, based on checks

and examination of evidence, without hearing the parties, it was found that there was no violation of the law on the basis of presented evidence. A total of 16 motions to initiate misdemeanour procedures have been filed for violations of the provisions on restrictions in the exercise of public office and conflict of interest. Following the issuance of Agency decisions establishing conflict of interest or incompatibility of office and opinions issued, public officials submitted 75 resignations, while in the reporting period after the initiation of the procedure before the Agency a service provision contract was terminated between a public official and government authority, as the Agency found its conclusion to be contrary to the law. A total of 59 requests from parties and bodies and other stakeholders, concerning the rights and obligations of public officials have been received and answered. Apart from the public officials, all decisions were also submitted to the government authority so as to get acquainted with the actions of the public official it had appointed, nominated or given its consent to and his/her attitude towards the public office, in order to undertake measures and act in accordance with the Law. All decisions finding public officials in breach of the law are made public on the Agency's website. The Agency submits notifications to all government authorities when it finds that a public official is in breach of the law - requests for

dismissal, suspension or imposition of disciplinary measures for public officials found to be in breach of the law under a finally-binding decision. During 2018, on the basis of decisions made regarding the conflict of interests and restrictions in the exercise of public office, government authorities acted in 15 cases: 3 public officials were dismissed; in the reporting period government authorities issued disciplinary measures – a conclusion of admonition with a cautionary measure in 8 cases, 4 government authorities' notifications were submitted that administrative procedure is underway. A total of 13 public officials submitted their resignations from positions in business organisations, after initiation of administrative proceedings before the Agency, while in 3 cases public officials repaid funds (in the amount of €4,605.97), which were found to have been received contrary to the provisions of the law. In cases that are underway, government authorities are obliged to notify the Agency in accordance with the law within 60 days from the date of receipt of the decision with a written explanation. From January 2018 to 20 December 2018, in accordance with Article 42 of the Law on Prevention of Corruption, prior to appointment/nomination procedure, 20 government authorities requested excerpts from Agency's records for 75 persons, as to whether in the four years prior to their

nomination they have been dismissed from public office for violation of the provisions of the Law. That is done in order to check whether any obstacles to their appointment exist. In accordance with Article 37 of the Law on Prevention of Corruption, which states that if the entity submitting the report indicates to the possibility of misuse of office and reasonable grounds for suspecting that a criminal offence prosecuted ex officio has been committed, the Agency shall submit to the competent state prosecutor's office the request with evidence collected in the exercise of its competence without delay. - The Special State Prosecutor's Office has pointed out to the Agency that in the report and the case files submitted by the Agency to the Prosecutor's Office there are no reasonable grounds for suspecting that a criminal offence prosecuted ex officio has been committed and that the case in question does not involve elements for conducting a procedure. A check of accuracy and completeness of received declarations/excerpts and related documents was made. There were no initiated procedures regarding received gifts, sponsorships and donations. Within the statutory time-limit, the Agency sent 9 requests to the government authorities for supplementing reports regarding received sponsorships or donations. The activities of the Agency were also related to checks of documents on 537 donations and 41

sponsorships received, in order to implement the statutory competences. The accuracy and completeness of received declarations/excerpts and accompanying documents were checked. After the expiration of the time-limit, checks were carried out with 7 government authorities that did not submit a report of donations and sponsorships received and feedback was obtained that they did not receive donations or sponsorships during 2017. Administrative procedures regarding the income and asset declarations: The Agency initiated, by 20 December 2018, 128 procedures, more specifically: it initiated and completed 54 procedures due to failure to submit a declaration within the timelimits prescribed in law, 43 procedures were initiated for submission of declarations including incorrect and incomplete data which were mostly initiated after the checks of declarations in November, and 24 procedures have been completed for the time being (the other procedures are underway). Also, 30 procedures were initiated in connection with checking the basis of acquisition and the sources of income and assets exceeding €5,000, out of which 25 procedures were completed. Decisions were issued finding that the relevant public officials provided detailed information concerning the basis of acquiring assets and income, i.e. they justified the basis of acquisition, while the other procedures are in the final stage.

The Agency has implemented one of the European Commission recommendations and since July 2018, it started, in accordance with its legal competences, to issue penalty notices for misdemeanours. Hence, by 20 December 2018 20 penalty notices for misdemeanours were issued, of which 8 were collected in the amount of €2,669.42. In 3 cases, misdemeanour courts imposed the protective measure - seizure of property gain - money that was gained contrary to the provisions of the law, pursuant to Article 50 of the Law on Misdemeanours, in the total amount of €12,537.15. The number of appeals filed by the Agency to courts against first instance decisions is 26 altogether, of which 11 were upheld until the reporting period.

Gifts Nine (9) government authorities submitted excerpts from the records of gifts, stating that public officials received a total of 127 gifts (4 special occasion gifts and 123 protocolary ones, and there were no gifts that could not be refused), while 30 government authorities, although they did not have the statutory obligation to do so, submitted reports stating that they had not received gifts. Donations and sponsorships As for the implementation of statutory competences relating to receiving donations and sponsorships, 72 government authorities submitted reports on received donations, stating that public officials received a total of 537 donations, while 30 government authorities submitted reports claiming that they did not receive donations and sponsorships. Also, 8 government authorities submitted reports on received sponsorships, stating that government authorities received a total of 41 sponsorships. All reported data starting after 31 March 2018 on received gifts, donations and sponsorships for 2018 have been processed and available on the

The officials of the Agency were participating within the IPA twinning project called "Support of the implementation of integrity measures ", in the reporting period July-December 2018, in the following educational and practical activities: Preparation of recommendations for improving integrity in sectors vulnerable to corruption – the sector of education. The development of the training plan for integrity manager and for conducting of the training: Italian experts conducted the training for the ACP officials on the process of developing an integrity plan in accordance with the ISO standards. Development of a training plan and program for persons designated to receive and act upon whistle-blower report (in other bodies): ACA officials, together with the Italian expert, have developed a training manual for persons designated to act upon whistle-blower report, as well as a new information brochure for these persons. Study Visit to Italian Institutions: Five Agency officials attended a study visit to Italy with the aim of familiarizing themselves with the institutional and legal framework of the whistle-blower. They visited and talked with representatives of the ANAC, the State Prosecutor's Office, the Court of Audit, the Financial Police. Conducting an analysis of the current application of standards related to lobbying: The Italian expert has worked with ACA officials in the light of the previously given recommendations for improving the implementation of the Law on Lobbying in

Montenegro, established a draft proposal for the Law on amendments to the Law on Lobbying. Evaluation of the effectiveness of measures for protection of whistle-blowers and affirmation through special workshops: In cooperation with the Chamber of Commerce of Montenegro, ACP organized a seminar on the topic "Institute of the whistle-blowers in the private sector". The gathering was attended by representatives of Montenegrin companies, and the exhibitors were representatives of ACP, PKCG and Italian experts from ANAC. Domestic legal obligations and the best international practice in this field were presented in order to train the participants in the process of applying for applications for endangering the public interest. A part of the lecture was dedicated to establishing of the mechanisms for reporting and handling of these applications within organizations. A new brochure for servants that are in charge of receiving handling the whistle-blowers report, was promoted. In accordance with the Law, the State Audit Institution audited the 2017 annual financial statements of 24 political entities. Within the framework of individual audit reports of political entities, there is a part referring to the implementation of recommendations given to the said entity previous year. That is how SAI monitors the implementation of past recommendations.

SAI: In accordance with Articles 4 and 12 of the Law on the State Audit Institution and Article 43 of the Law on Financing Political Entities and Electoral Campaigns, in 2018 the State Audit Institution (SAI) audited the annual financial statements of 24 (twenty

four) political entities whose income in 2017 exceeded €10,000.00.

After calculating the planned materiality threshold, reviewing the 2017 financial statements and getting acquainted with the activities of the audited entity and the alike, the following audit segments are planned: functioning of the internal control system, revenue and expenditure planning, activities of party bodies, accounting records and financial statements, income, expenditures and balance sheet items (fixed assets, cash-in-hand and cash in accounts receivable/payable). In addition to the audit of the mentioned segments, implementation of SAI recommendations given in the Audit report of annual financial statements of audited entities for the previous year (2016) was checked.

The State Audit Institution has published 24 (twenty-four) individual reports on the audit of political entities, which contain an opinion with an overview of identified irregularities and recommendations given, a general part, established facts of the state in planned segments and implementation of previous year's recommendations. The opinions are given in the standardized form, in accordance with the accepted financial reporting framework. The opinion was influenced by materiality, as well as the importance of irregularities that influenced the financial

statements and activities of the audited entity. Seventeen unqualified opinions and 7 qualified ones were given to the financial audit, while 9 unqualifed, 5 qualified and 10 adverse opinions were given to the regularity audit. The audit determined individual deviations and inconsistencies with the Law on Financing of Local Self-Government, Law on Budget and Fiscal Responsibility and the Rulebook on allocation and use of funds of the Equalization Fund.Based on the conducted audit and determined facts, the competent Auditing Board expressed qualified opinion. The competent Auditing Board concluded that the scope and character of the identified irregularities and shortcomings in the audited entity required that the Government, the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Public Administration should become acquainted with the contents of the Report so that measures could be taken to establish a sustainable framework and responsibilities in the management of public finances, as well as the Committee on Economy, Budget and Finance of the Parliament of Montenegro. Audit of the municipalities of Kolašin and Berane is in progress. Through transparent work, the State Audit Institution of Montenegro will continue completing its mission and contribute to increased regularity, effectiveness and efficiency of management of public finances and state property. In the reporting period, the State Audit
Institution audited the final statement of the

Municipality of Kolašin budget for 2017 and published the same on the website on 14 September 2018.

The financial audit of the final statement of the Municipality of Kolašin budget for 2017 found that the 2017 financial statements contain misstatements, which have a pervading character, both individually and collectively. The audit found that the data reported in the Consolidated Public Expenditure Report, by individual budget positions of revenues and expenditures, do not correspond to the actual data, which led to a difference in the financial result (surplus) in the amount of €136,783.69, that is, a cash surplus according to financial data for 2017 is presented in the amount of €330,139.05, but it should amount to €466,922.74. Therefore, the competent panel gave an an adverse opinion.

Audit of the regularity of the Decision on the final statement of the Municipality of Kolašin for 2017, found that the Municipality did not fully align all business activities with legal and other regulations. The audit found individual deviations and inconsistencies with the following laws and by-laws: the Law on the Internal Financial Control in the Public Sector, Law on Local Self-Government Funding, Law on Budget and Fiscal Responsibility, Law on Tax Administration, Law on Spatial Planning and Construction, Law on Public Sector Salaries, Law on Civil Servants and State Employees, Law on Financing of Political Entities and Election Campaigns, Law on State Property,

Rulebook on classification of tangible and intangible assets by groups and methods for determining the depreciation of budgetary and extrabudgetary users, Rulebook on uniformed classification of the accounts for the budget of Montenegro and the budgets of municipalities and the Instructions on the work of the local self-government treasury, which also have a material and permeable character. Based on that, the competent panel gave an adverse opinion.

In the reporting period, SAI also audited the final statement of the Municipality of Berane for 2017 and published the same on the website on 26 October 2018.

The financial audit of the final statement of the Municipality of Berane budget for 2017 found that the 2017 financial statements were compiled in all material aspects in accordance with the applicable financial reporting framework and presented in a fair and objective manner. Accordingly, the competent panel gave an unqualified opinion.

Regularity audit of the Decision on the final statement of the municipality of Berane for 2017, it was found that the municipality did not fully harmonize all business activities with legal and other regulations. We would like to point out that the Government of Montenegro, with a view to implementing the eGovernment in Montenegro, has implemented the eGovernment Internet portal project www.euprava.me (for which the Ministry of Public Administration is in charge), through which all state administration institutions and local self-government units have the possibility to provide services to natural and legal persons, as well as to other institutions, by electronic means.

On 9 December 2018, on the International Anti-Corruption Day, the Police Administration launched the campaign Do Not Keep Your Eyes Shut, Report Corruption, whereby the police wishes to inform the citizens about the importance of their more active role in detecting and combating corruption by reporting acts of corruption and to send the message that any information about possible corruption that citizens report to the police are important because fight against corruption is one of the priorities in the work of the police. The campaign encourages citizens to report

even the smallest form of corruption because there is no person, either in the public or private sector, who can ask the citizen for money or service in return for something that has already been paid for. For this reason, the police send a clear message to citizens not to close their eyes to corruption, but to report it. A note is included to the effect that, should they so wish, they can report corruption anonymously. During December and January of next year, traffic police officers will be distributing leaflets to citizens, on roads and at BCPs, containing information on the ways to report corruption and police actions taken on corruption reports. In addition to leaflets, billboards Do Not Keep Your Eyes Shut, Report Corruption were placed in eight biggest towns. Media appearances of police representatives are a continuous method for promoting corruption reporting and protecting citizens reporting corruption. In addition to that, there is a special section on the website of the Police Administration intended for citizens who wish to report corruption. It also has to be underlined that the Government of Montenegro, in order to introduce eGovernment in Montenegro, has implemented the project e-Government portal www.euprava.me (under the Ministry of Public Administration), through which all state administration bodies and local selfgovernment units have the possibility to provide services to natural and legal entities, as well as other institutions.



Police officers deprived of liberty and conducted to the basic state prosecutor in Bijelo Polje Zvrko Denis the following persons: Pepić Hilmo (1997) from Bijelo Polje and Pepić Ilhan (1984) from Rožaje, because there are grounds for suspicion that they have been committed the CO unauthorized possession of weapons and explosive devices referred to in Art. 403 par. 2 of the CC, which they committed on 1 April 2018 in a way that they by prior arrangement came to the house where the journalist Sead Sadiković resides,

owned by Muslić Nedira, in the St. Munib

Dacia with registration labels BG 897 HN,
parked in the street in front of the house in

On 8 May 2018, around 20,50h, at the boulevard Sveti Petar Cetinjski, in front of the entrance of the building in which she resides, the journalist of the IN "Vijesti", Olivera Lakić, suffered injuries due to the use of firearms in the area of the right lower thigh, after which she was kept in the Clinical Centre for treatment. The competent prosecutor qualified the event as murder in an attempt referred to in Art. 143 in conjuction with the Art. 20 of the CC. Work on illumination of the criminal offense is ongoing.

Note: On 12 May 2018, it was reported that there had been damage to the glass at the office of the advertising department of the DN "Sloboda" in the St. Stanka Dragojevića in Podgorica. Activities are in progress to determine the relevant facts regarding the circumstances of the occurrence of the

damage. Thus, out of the reported four cases in the reporting period, two were resolved. children familiar with the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, basic principles and recommendations for the promotion of the rights of the child in Montenegro, as well as their role in the process. The training workshop was attended by a total of 25 children (22 newly elected gold advisers and 3 gold advisers from an earlier generation), primary and secondary school, from different cities of Montenegro, two of which are children with disabilities. Children who participated in training workshops are from Podgorica, Danilovgrad, Budva, Nikšić, Kolašin, Rožaje, Berane, Cetinje.

Furthermore, Golden Advisors have participated in the research of the level of mental health care of children in Montenegro. They conducted an opinion poll (using a questionnaire) among their peers and thus collected the views of children about the protection of mental health during adolescence. The Golden Advisors, together with the representatives of the Protector, led the Conference marking the Universal Children's Day on 20 November 2018 and held a regular meeting of the Network on the same day. By this phase of trainings with a creative and educational workshop approach, children got familiar with the basics of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, the basic principles and recommendations for the promotion of the rights of the child in Montenegro, as well as their role in that process. The training workshop was attended by a total of 25 children (22 newly elected gold advisors and 3 gold advisors from the previous generation), of elementary and secondary school age, from different cities of Montenegro, two of which are children with disabilities. Children who participated in training workshops are from Podgorica, Danilovgrad, Budva, Nikšić, Kolašin, Rožaje, Berane, Cetinje. In addition to these activities, a continuous tour of elementary schools in Montenegro continued with the aim of informing children with their rights, as well as the competencies of the Institution, and visits were intensified of resource centers, clinical departments, pediatric departments and outpatient centers specialized in dealing with children with problems in mental health. Brochures were distributed and necessary

information shared. In February and March were visited elementary schools "Blažo Jokov Orlandić" Bar, "Sutjeska" Podgorica, "Risto Manojlović" Kolašin, gymnasium Cetinje, gymnasium "Slobodan Škerović", ES "Njegoš"Kotor, Secondary maritime school in Kotor, gymnasium Kotor, ES "Veljko Drobnjaković" Risan. Institution representatives visited also pupils' homes in Kotor "Spasić – Mašera" and Nikšić. In April and May ware intensified visits to resource centres in Podgorica "Resource centre 1st of June" i "Resource centre Podgorica, Center for Autism, Institute for Child Diseases and Day Center for Children with Disabilities in Podgorica in order to check the conditions and standards in institutions specialized for care of children with mental health problems.

In addition to the aforementioned, in 2018 the Protector dealt intensively with the degree of protection of mental health of children. Hence, visits were organised in September to primary healthcare centres, centres for children with special needs and mental health centres at the level of primary child care in Herceg Novi, Bar, Nikšić, Pljevlja, Podgorica, Berane and Bijelo Polje, as well as day care centres for children with disabilities. For the purposes of mental health research, the Protector

interviewed the children and asked for their opinions thereon. Namely, having in mind the importance of child participation and the fact that children know best how they really feel, how much assistance and support they receive from professionals, and whether they recognize situations that pose a risk to preserving their mental health, the Protector conducted an opinion poll among 260 children from various towns of Montenegro, aged between 13 and 16, and held 4 focus groups on protection and importance of mental health of children. The questionnaire was distributed to children throughout Montenegro with the help of Ombudsman's Network of Golden Advisors and the Union of High School Students. The Protector celebrated Universal Children's Day, on 20 November 2018, with the conference Mental Health of Children in Montenegro. A special report on the mental health of children was presented at that conference. Together with the representatives of Protector's institution, the Conference was led by children (Golden Advisors) who presented the views and opinions of children in Montenegro on this topic. It also served as the traditional final conference of Ombudsman's Network of Golden Advisors. Representatives of the Protector visited 14 elementary schools and 4 secondary schools in Podgorica, Bar, Nikšić, Mojkovac and Bijelo Polje from

September to December and held creative educational workshops with children in order to inform them about the rights of the child and the responsibilities of the Protector. In addition, two panel discussions on the importance of nonviolent communication were held in the Secondary School of Economics and the Grammar School Niko Rolović in Bar. The Protector issued 3 publications in 2018: Alternative Report on the Second and Third Periodic Reports on the Application of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, UN Committee on the Rights of the Child and Mental Health of Children in Montenegro. All these publications were distributed to children and professionals throughout Montenegro during visits, tours and activities organised directly with children, as well as with the help of the Golden Advisors. In December, the Protector initiated the signing of a special Protocol on the treatment of children living and/or working on the streets in the territory of Montenegro, in order to improve the protection of guaranteed rights of children spending their time on the street and their childhood in extremely risky conditions. Children with developmental disorders covered by the regular education system (12) 30 June 2018 [CI] 24 members of the mobile service had 1116 half-hour activities from February to June. In schools with integrated departments, one (1) workshop for the local community was held, and several workshops for parents, pupils and teachers from schools. The program "Strengthening Inclusive Education through Assistive Services and Promotion of Non-Discrimination" is under way, within which the component strengthening assistance services for children with autism and the assistive capacity of resource centers is being implemented. After the study tour and training in cooperation with the schoolresource center "Milan Petrović", Novi Sad, presentations of assistive cabinets in resource centers were conducted with the aim of informing schools about how to produce working materials, specialized teaching, didactic and assisted communication instruments, how these instruments are ordered, and so on. Trainings on implementation carried out: drafting of communication books and other alternative forms of communication and stimulation of interaction, adjustment instructions for staff of the RC "1st of June". Experts of the school-resource center "Milan Petrović", Novi Sad, were

engaged. After that, the staff of the RC "1st of June" organized an instructional training for schools related to assisted communication; the basic team (employees who attended training in Novi Sad), the advisory team (employed defectologists from the center who attended the training "Creation and use of assisted communication means") and the creative team (the basic team and educators who attended the training " Creation and use of assisted communication means") were formed. In the 1st phase of the training, the content consists of the following topics: visual support for labeling of rooms in the school, visual support in the classroom which provides structure, visual support for the rules of conduct in the classroom, visual support for hand washing in steps. Accordingly, after the initial advisory training for schools "Creation and use of assisted communication means", a visit to primary schools in Podgorica was conducted with the aim of analyzing the needs of children with autism who are being educated in them, and creation of working and assisted communication material. Also, focus groups were conducted with primary school teachers, in which schools the largest number of pupils with intellectual disabilities attends classes, in order to define the model of work, assessment and needs analysis, making recommendations for teacher

guide and for program of professional development. On the basis of the conducted research, the Guidance for work with children with intellectual disabilities has been developed, which contains description of the research, definition of intellectual disorders and description of characteristics and needs of this children, approaches in work, recommendations, examples in practice. The accompanying training program was prepared. Trainings were conducted for representatives of 30 primary schools from all over Montenegro in which the majority of children with intellectual disabilities are being educated. Trainings were conducted for over 120 teachers of elementary schools (representatives of math and Montenegrin, Serbian, Bosnian and Croatian languages and literature who have experience in working with pupils with intellectual disabilities) on 13, 14, 19, 20 and 21 June 2018. The workshop offered a description of the functioning of a child with intellectual disabilities, understanding of adaptive abilities and approaches in work; Developing competencies for adapting the teaching process to children with intellectual disabilities through examples of good practice and fostering individualization of the teaching process through the preparation of adjusted and targeted teaching and working material. A package for school-level activities on nondiscrimination has been developed. The idea is to organize a "Non-discrimination Day" during one school year, conduct age workshops for all pupils and set of workshops for teaching staff in order to strengthen their positive and attitudes of acceptance, culture and practice of nondiscrimination in schools. These and other innovative ideas, information available on an inclusive portal which is updated regularly. Through the project "Strengthening democratic culture in schools" - EU / CoE Horizontal mechanism the Western Balkans and Turkey, established a network of 26 pilot schools (gymnasiums, secondary mixed and 3 primary schools where a significant number of children of the RE population is being educated); 4 coordinators engaged to be supportive and who trained teams of point schools to conduct workshops and activities on democratic culture; numerous school inclusive activities were conducted, on 15-17 May an international conference was held on the following topic: Combating discrimination in the education system. A teaching package was developed. Training of teachers and expert assistants is one of the activities of the program Improving the reading and writing skills by improving the quality of teaching and learning which will enhance the teachers' competencies in providing adequate assistance to students with learning disabilities. Four trainings were

conducted in schools, which included 90 teachers from 24 primary schools (teachers of class teaching and expert assistants). Trainings were held on 12, 17, 24 and 31 March, 2018. Monitoring was carried out during May and June, on which occasion 12 visits were organized to schools participants in the program, which passed the training Roadmap and did assessment in the classes of the I cycle. About 3600 pupils were included. By using methodical models, the pre-reading and reading and writing skills are being improved, individual approach to learning developed, materials for work adjusted. Within the program Improving the quality of inclusive education - integration of efficient and innovative programs of support for teaching and learning, the initiative Strengthening capacity and increasing the number of schools using DAISY textbooks in regular teaching is being implemented. During May and June, four trainings for the use of history textbooks with DAISY form were organized (11, 15, 17 May and 5 June, 2018). The participants of seminars were teachers of the history of 50 schools using DAISY readers, whose teachers (5 per school) have been trained to use readers in DAISY format. (13) 31 December 2018 [CI] Mobile services had 2,285 half-hour activities from September to December

2018. In accordance with the work plan of schools with integrated classes as branch offices of resource centres, 10 workshops were held in those schools for the local community, as well as 8 workshops for parents, pupils and teachers from other schools. The component Strengthening Assistive Services for Children with Autism and Assistive Capacities of Resource Centers is being implemented under the programme Strengthening Inclusive Education through Assistive Services and Promotion of Non-Discrimination, which will be followed by creating packages for the prevention of discrimination in schools and organising training courses for their use. A training course on the development and implementation of communication books intended for children with disabilities from the spectrum of autism was organised for elementary schools: Savo Pejanović, 21. maj, Sutjeska, Milorad Musa Burzan, Vuk Karadžić from Podgorica, Maksim Gorki, Ilija Kišić from Herceg Novi, Dr Dragiša Ivanović, Vladimir Nazor, Štampar Makarije, Radojica Perović, Vlado Milić, Vuk Karadžić from Berane, which was held at the PI Resource Center for Children and Persons with Intellectual Disabilities and Autism 1. jun in Podgorica. The plan was for teachers and professional associates to understand the purpose, application and use of communication books in working with children with autism. The

training course was held on 25 and 26 October 2018. Members of the team for the development of didactic materials visited and held informative meetings in 15 mainstream schools in Podgorica and one elementary school in Tuzi. In order to promote non-discrimination, we designed a programme package on the topic of equal rights and non-discrimination. In order to start using the information material on the rights from the field of non-discrimination, we organised 5 training courses for managers, teachers and professional associates from schools in Montenegro per regions: 6 November 2018 Podgorica, 7 November 2018 Nikšić, 12 November 2018 and 14 November 2018 municipalities in the north, 15 November 2018 south/coastal region. Under the Horizontal Facility Action "Fostering a Democratic School Culture" -EU/CoE Horizontal Facility for the Western Balkans and Turkey, a network of 26 pilot schools was established (grammar schools, secondary schools and 3 elementary schools attended by a significant number of RE children), 4 coordinators were hired as support and trainers for schools. In order to promote equality, the Diversity and Inclusion Day was celebrated at the Independence Square on 11 October 2018, with all the participating schools presenting their pupils' works in stands. Training of teachers and professional associates is

one of the activities of the Programme Improving Reading and Writing Skills by Improving the Quality of Teaching and Learning that will improve teachers' competences in providing adequate assistance to pupils with learning disabilities. The training course was also held in December 2018. Monitoring was carried out in November, with 24 visits organised to schools participating in the programme which have passed the training Putokaz and carried out evaluation in classes of the 1st cycle. About 6,000 pupils and 67 schools were included. During September, 3 seminars for the use of readers in Daisy format and one seminar for the use of history textbooks (in 2018 - 68 schools included) were organised. In cooperation with the Vocational Education Centre and KulturKontakt, the following training courses were held: six two-day seminars for ITP-1's development 13-14 December 2018 Podgorica, 6-7 December 2018 Nikšić, 29-30 October 2018 Kolašin, 8-9 November 2018, Berane, 29-30 November 2018, Bar, 22-23 November 2018, Kotor, for 208 participants. Also, six one-day training courses for ITP-2's development, with 96 participants from high schools, were organised: 20 December 2018 Podgorica, 9 November 2018 Bijelo Polje, 11 December 2018 Nikšić, 13 November 2018 Berane, 7 December 2018 Kotor, and 4 December 2018 Bar. Even though the area of public procurement is covered in detail in Negotiating Chapter 5 - Public Procurement, but also in the AP 23, the Operational Document contains measures in this area as well, since public procurement are defined as a special risk area under the Strategy for Fight against Corruption and Organised Crime (2010-2014). Measures in this area are primarily related to improving the normative framework, but also to strengthening of administrative capacity for implementing regulations and providing technical requirements to establish an efficient and transparent electronic public procurement system. According to the data from the latest report on the implementation of the AP for Fight Against Corruption and Organised Crime (2013-2014), five measures on public procurement were implemented (71.43%), two measures were partially implemented (28.57%), while there were no measures rated as not implemented.

II PRIVATISATION (PUBLICITY AND TRANSPARENCY) -

Domestic legal framework on privatization needs to be improved by adopting new laws and bylaws for its implementation. As regards institutions, there are plans to establish an Agency for Investments and independent bodies for controlling the operations of privatized monopoly companies. Implementation of other measures in this area will contribute to the transparency of work of the Privatization and Capital Projects Council and to the improvement of work of the Privatization Processes Monitoring and Control Commission of the Parliament of Montenegro. In addition to that, measures envisage organization of public debates in order to develop privatization strategies for companies of particular interest to the public, especially in the field of transport, tourism and energy, as well as providing access to information of importance for this area. According to the latest report on the implementation of the Anti-Corruption and Organized Crime Action Plan, five measures were implemented in this area (31.25%), nine measures were partially implemented (56.25%) and two measures were not implemented (12.50%).

According to the data from the latest report on the implementation of the Anti-Corruption and Organized Crime Action Plan, seven (63.64%) measures were implemented in this area, while two measures were partially implemented (18.18%) and not implemented (18.18%), respectively.

V HEALTH CARE SECTOR -

The health care sector, as one of the seven special risk areas, takes an important place in the Operational Document. In accordance with the challenges faced in this area, measures have been defined related to improvement of secondary legislation needed for implementation of laws, monitoring corruption cases in the health care sector, as well as improving information systems in order to better manage the health care system by establishing indicators, rationally using resources and raising the quality of health care services and identifying possible abuses of office. According to the data from the latest report on the implementation of the Anti-Corruption and Organized Crime Action Plan, 11 measures were implemented in this area (84.62%), while two measures were partially implemented (15.38%).

Bearing in mind the particularities and differences concerning local self-governments, measures in this area are focused on the development of the Integrity Plan for local self-government units, ensuring transparency of the employment process in local self-government bodies, improving transparency in the process of implementing public procurement procedures and monitoring the organisation of public procurement in municipalities, improving the cooperation between the civil and private sector and LSGUs for inclusion in the fight against corruption at the local level, as well as establishing channels for reporting corruption in local self-governments. According to the latest report on the implementation of the Anti-Corruption and Organized Crime Action Plan, seven measures were implemented in this area (77.78%), two measures were partially implemented (22.22%) while there were no unimplemented measures.

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 239 of the Law on Spatial Planning and Construction, this Ministry decides on complaints against the decision of the competent local government authority on the amount of the fee for construction land connection to utilities pending the adoption of a General Regulation Plan of Montenegro. In the period from 1 January to 1 December 2018, there were 10 complaints filed against the decisions of the competent local government authority on the amount of the

construction land connection to utilities fee. Out of 10 complaints, 9 complaints were resolved, and one complaint is pending. As for administrative supervision over the legality of work of local self-government units, in order to monitor the implementation of the Law on Spatial Planning and Construction, the Government gave its consent to the decisions on connection of construction land to utility infrastructure for the following 15 municipalities: Andrijevica, Berane, Bijelo Polje, Cetinje, Danilovgrad, Gusinje, Kotor, Mojkovac, Nikšić, Plav, Plužine, Podgorica, Šavnik, Tivat and Ulcinj. In the course of performing administrative supervision over the legality of work of local self-government units aimed at monitoring the implementation of the Law on Utility Services, in the reporting period the Ministry of Sustainable Development and Tourism provided verbal and written opinions on the compliance of municipal decisions with the Law on Utility Services. It should be noted that a piece of secondary legislation, the Decree on Elements and Methodology for Determining Prices of Utility Services is being drafted, which will help local selfgovernment units to align their decisions with the Law on Utility Services. Regular communication with local selfgovernment units and their public utility
